

TROOP CODE OF CONDUCT

All Scouts are expected to:

- a. **Obey the Scout Law, Scout Oath and the Outdoor Code.**
- b. **Respect the feelings of others and follow the policy that scouting is a safe haven.**
- c. **Respect the property of others.**
- d. **Respect the environment.**
- e. **Leave each campsite in better condition than found.**
- f. **Stay on marked trails, don't cut switchbacks.**
- g. **Follow the direction of assigned boy leaders and adults.**
- h. **Wear and respect his uniform.**
- i. **Be silent when the sign is up.**
- j. **Do his fair share of patrol and troop chores.**
- k. **Be safe at all times in their use of knives, axes and fire.**
- l. **Refrain from throwing objects at tents or others.**
- m. **Refrain from 'tenting'.**
- n. **Use no alcohol or illegal drugs.**

By signing below both the scout and parents acknowledge the above minimum standards required of each scout at patrol and troop meetings, activities and outings. Scouts, who violate the above policy, will be warned by the adult in charge of the meeting, activity or outing. If, after a second warning, there is no improvement in behavior, the adult leader in charge will, at his or her discretion, have the option to call that scout's parents to come and take their boy home. Any serious violation of the above policy, which in the opinion of the adult leader in charge, seriously affects the safety or well being of any other scout, adult or the environment, will be sufficient and immediate cause to call the parents, without any warning, to take their boy home. In either event, the affected scout must request a Scoutmaster's conference and secure his permission prior to attending any other official troop activity, meeting or outing. In severe cases, permission will only be granted only if the scout's parents also attend the meeting, activity or outing.
